Lack of funding is the overriding reason why those holding a graduate offer from Oxford turn it down. With various research funding bodies having announced further cuts of near 25% to the number of studentships by 2030, this situation will only get worse. Thank you to all our donors who gave to scholarships, especially at the graduate level, where the need is particularly significant.

Organ Scholarship

Thanks to the generosity of many of our alumni, the College was able to endow three organ scholarships named in memory of St Hugh's alumna, and one of the UK's leading organists, Catherine Ennis (Music, 1973). This scholarship seeks to recognise promising young organists and support further development of their skills. This scholarship is unique in that it is only awarded to those who have demonstrated exceptional talent.

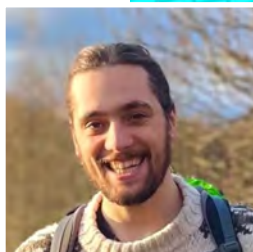

Supporting Early Career Researchers

In Michaelmas 2023, St Hugh's welcomed its 17th Career Development Fellow, Dr Nikolaus Vertovic. It is only through the generosity of our alumni and friends that the College has been able to offer so many of these innovative fellowships. These posts are vital to early career academics, enhance the dynamic research community at the College, and ensure that our students are engaging with and learning from the best in the world.

St Hugh's has a long and proud tradition of research and innovation in the field of computers and computer science. Continuing in this tradition, thanks to a generous gift from Dr Anna Patterson, a distinguished leader and researcher in Artificial Intelligence and member of the St Hugh's community, the College was able to offer a three-year fellowship in Artificial Intelligence. A major aspect of this post will also be to promote study and research into AI through an annual programme of events highlighting current research in this area.

Nikolaus' research focuses on enforcing safety in AI including the verification of learned models and safety enforcement during the training of learning-based controllers for complex dynamical systems. His work has been applied to spacecraft trajectory design and airborne wind energy, among other applications.

What is a Career Development Fellowship?

Career Development Fellowships are three-year posts designed specifically for early career researchers to provide a vibrant research environment in which to further develop their own independent research while gaining experience teaching and collaborating with other academic colleagues. Many similar positions are limited to one-year posts, but the College believes it is important to make a sustained commitment to early career academics to provide stability and time to develop their research programme.



Sustaining our Buildings

As the result of a very generous donation from Elizabeth Wordsworth Fellows, Eddy and Emily Tang, the College was able to unlock University match funding to refurbish all the en-suite bathrooms in the Rachel Trickett Building. These extensive renovations have brought the bathrooms up to a high-quality standard, dramatically improving our student living space. It is from the generosity of all our donors who give towards our buildings that we were also able to take this opportunity to implement and install a suite of sustainability solutions to lower our water usage, reduce emissions, and limit cleaning chemicals. The feedback from students has been overwhelmingly positive and we are taking the success and lessons learned from this project forward as we look towards the upcoming Library renovation.

Transforming our Gardens

In 2020, our Gardens Team and the College made a commitment to integrate organic and sustainable practices into the care of our 14-acre site. As of Summer 2022, our gardens are now 100% organic – often a statement that's easily thrown around but at St Hugh's it is truly the case. From discontinuing the use of non-organic herbicide, pesticide, fungicide and other chemical treatments, to sourcing additional electric machinery to eliminate noise pollution and CO₂ emissions, increasing composting of garden waste inhouse, recycling garden weeds to produce liquid fertilizer, and turning arboriculture waste into woodchips, among many other initiatives. Our commitment to sustainable site management would be impossible without the generous support of our donors who have given to the gardens.

Expanding our Library

In 1939, alumna, Fellow, former Librarian, and one of our most generous donors, Dame Joan Evans (Archaeology, 1914), made a very generous gift to the College of over 100 items for the Library and Archives. While completing the valuation of our rare book collection earlier this year, Head Librarian, Dr Nora Khayi, suspected that one of the donated books – Elias Ashmole's *The Way to Bliss* - might be rarer than originally thought. After an investigation by the Newton Project, it has been confirmed that our copy of Ashmole's *The Way to Bliss* was indeed owned by Sir Isaac Newton. It is hoped that this discovery will be of great interest to Newton scholars and anyone interested in understanding Newton's relationship with his books which shaped part of his intellectual experience. The Library is always pleased to receive donations as well as books from our alumni and friends. The work of the Library, and its extensive collection, is greatly reliant on the generosity of our donors to the Library and Archives.

The Library holds over 85,500 books, which include 3500 volumes from our special collection. On average, 500 books are purchased every year.



Legacy Giving

Legacy gifts have been foundational to the College, helping us to provide the gift of a world-class Oxford education to countless students from a range of backgrounds.

St Hugh's is honoured to be one of two Oxford colleges hosting scholarships supported by an extremely generous legacy left to the English Faculty, St Hugh's and Lady Margaret Hall by our late Honorary Fellow, Professor Anne Hudson (English Language & Literature, 1957).

The graduate scholarship held at St Hugh's is named after one of the College's most distinguished English scholars, Professor Pamela Gradon, who was also Professor Hudson's tutor at St Hugh's as well as a colleague, friend and close collaborator on the enormous Wycliffite Sermons project. Professor Gradon was a Fellow and Tutor at St Hugh's between 1963 and 1982, following which she was elected an Emeritus Fellowship..

We were delighted to welcome our first Pamela Gradon scholar, Hanna Baker Darch, in Michaelmas 2023. Hanna's work explores how western ideologies have been shaped by characters described as 'Enemies of Christ', by comparing literary and visual representations of monstrosity against discriminatory depictions of religious, cultural, and ethnic identities.

“Receiving the Pamela Gradon studentship is an honour that will extend far beyond the duration of my DPhil. The generosity of Professor Anne Hudson is testament to the impact this field has on the lives of its scholars, and I am endlessly grateful that my research has been recognised in line with her extraordinary legacy and love for medieval studies.”

Bursar's Letter

During 2021-22 and 2022-23 the College saw significant inflationary pressure on its budget: initially from energy costs (which rose from £363,000 to £1,027,000 over the period) and subsequently from wage increases and the escalating price of raw materials. The impact was particularly acute because, in spite of having the fourth largest student body in the University, St Hugh's has the third smallest endowment of any mixed (undergraduate and postgraduate) college.

Because the cost of educating someone at Oxford is more than double the average level of fees that a student pays, our annual endowment income was already fully committed before the rise in energy prices. As a result, every penny of additional inflation has had to be covered by saving costs elsewhere; by redeploying reserves to buy time to make longer-term structural changes to our expenditure; and by the hard-won recovery of our commercial conference business following the financial shock of the COVID-19 lockdowns.

However, this ongoing effort from colleagues across the college would still have been insufficient without the extraordinary generosity of our donors. Precious unrestricted funds from the annual appeal allowed us to sustain valuable student-facing activities that would otherwise have come under economic strain; donations for student financial support helped mitigate the acute impact of the cost of living crisis on our most financially disadvantaged students; funding for new Early Career Researcher positions enabled ground-breaking research while nurturing the next generation of academics; and donations to the endowment helped improve the College's financial position for the years and decades ahead.

As we prepare for the recruitment and arrival of a new Principal and look ahead to the 150th anniversary in 2036, we are mindful that our financial sustainability depends on growing the endowment, and in particular the endowment of Tutorial Fellowship to safeguarding the future of our subject mix and Oxford's unique system of teaching. Alongside this, our ambitions for the environmental sustainability of the College site (and especially for achieving net zero carbon emissions by 2035) will also require substantial funding. This is a significant challenge, but with the continued support of our alumni and donors, we believe it is an achievable one.
